**Pre-Requisites:**

The individual must hold an AAPC certification, be a member in good standing and have at least five years coding experience.

The individual must have completed and submitted the PMCC instructor application and supply two letters of recommendation. (<http://www.aapc.com/documents/PII.pdf>)

**Course Description:**

The Physician Medical Coding Instructor Certification course prepares the candidate for a career in teaching future coders through comprehension of the coding curriculum, understanding the needs of adult learners, practical application, and teaching certification.

1. Proficiency in teaching the guidelines of the CPT<sup>®</sup>, ICD-9-CM, and HCPCS Coding manuals.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of the motivations of adult learners and factors involved in teaching adult learners.

4. Techniques for a solid business plan and marketing yourself.
5. Demonstrate an understanding of the PMCC Instructor License Program.

A 15 minute presentation is required and evaluated by peers; evaluation forms are submitted to AAPC for evaluation and returned to candidate.
